# Antigone Writing Assignment!

Write a short essay (3-4 pages) that answers one of the questions posed in questions 52-59 of your <u>Antigone</u> Study Guide. The essay should reflect

- an accurate understanding of the text,
- a serious effort to think through the questions posed and to say something meaningful and insightful, and
- diligent effort at revising and editing to polish your draft.

Follow the steps of the writing process:

- collect ideas
- develop a logical essay plan with clear, focused MSP's (See outline format below)
- include rich, clear content/ make sure you have "spoon fed" your analysis to your reader
- revise + edit carefully Do justice to your good ideas!

## ① Essay Plan (Outline) due Wednesday, February 23. PRINT OUT 2 COPIES.

#### 🖋 Essay Plan Format - TYPE

- > <u>Prompt selected</u>: (Restate the question that you will be answering, and CIRCLE the KEY WORDS.)
- Working Thesis Statement/ Preview of Support a single sentence that explicitly and completely answers all parts of the prompt and previews the MSP's. (Preview of support could be in a 2d sentence.) When you write your thesis, it's a good idea to use key words of prompt to stay anchored to the question.

#### Main Supporting Point #1 (full sentence)

Under this MSP, outline (bullet) how you will develop this paragraph--include supporting arguments, examples, + analysis. *Be sure to have specific proof from text and cites*.

#### MSP 2 (full sentence)

Under this MSP, outline (bullet) how you will develop this paragraph--include supporting arguments, examples, + analysis. *Be sure to have specific proof from text and cites*.

#### MSP 3 (full sentence)

Under this MSP, outline (bullet) how you will develop this paragraph--include supporting arguments, examples, + analysis. *Be sure to have specific proof from text and cites*.

<u>Conclusion</u> – Echo thesis and add closure by adding broad observation ("going universal"/ "so what") and/or providing reader with a modern application.

### First Draft of Essay due on -TO BE ANNOUNCED.

**Y**Your essay will be graded based upon the rubric on the reverse side.

Checklist/ Rubric for First Graded Draft - Any errors in the bolded areas will result in a top grade of B-

Focus

- **Does the essay answer the specific question asked?**
- Does the essay contain a focused thesis statement that responds to the prompt? Uses key words?
- Does every sentence in the essay relate to and support the thesis statement?
  - No irrelevant statements/ digressions
  - All topic sentences are linked specifically to the thesis statement with key words?
- □ Is the thesis echoed (but <u>not</u> repeated verbatim) in the conclusion?

Organization

- □ Introduction funnels down to thesis/ thesis appears at end of introduction
- **Each** body paragraph has one MSP identified in topic sentence which explicitly links to thesis and completely covers the paragraph
- **D** Topic sentences are 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> sentence in paragraph
- □ Logical order to body paragraphs
- □ Logical order of ideas within body paragraph
- □ Body paragraphs "wrap up" smoothly and with closure
- Uses *appropriate* transition words to connect body paragraphs
- Uses *appropriate* transition words to connect ideas within body paragraphs
- □ Smooth conclusion/ "goes universal"/ connects to broader point

Content - really says something meaningful that is developed, supported, and analyzed fully.

- □ Title appropriate and interesting
- □ Intro. paragraph is engaging, clear, relevant + explicitly mentions name of work and author.
- □ The body paragraphs <u>prove</u> the assertion of the thesis.
- **The assertion of each topic sentence is fully supported by <b>proof** from book & analysis
- □ All statements about text are supported with <u>cited</u> examples (2 examples are better than 1.)
- □ All examples are explained so that the reader understands how the examples prove what you say that they prove
- □ All statements are relevant to the thesis and MSP of paragraph
- **D** Reasoning is logical & with enough development to be clear and persuasive
- □ All statements about text are accurate
- □ No unnecessary repeats of ideas!
- **D** Essay shows thoughtful analysis of the issue
- □ Works Cited page with correct and complete format

#### Style

- Clear / concise /precise, formal word choice/ no ambiguous pronouns
- □ No 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> person/ person consistency/ no contractions/ no faulty parallelism
- Good flow to sentences/ no missing words or awkward constructions
- □ Smooth quote weaving

#### Edit

- □ All rules covered in class are applied- CCW's, possessives, clauses, other comma rules, P/A, usage, & titles
- □ No fragments, run-ons, comma splices
- □ Appropriate & consistent verb tense
- □ Neatness/ double spaced/ proofread/ no missing words/ rubric stapled to front of draft
- □ Correct in-text citation + general MLA format
