Each MSP should show how the message is conveyed through one specific character. Explain to your reader how a character who "lives" the message experiences a positive outcome---or if the character doesn't "live" the message, how that character is disgraced or suffers a loss. Back up your claims about a character's actions and outcome with text proof.
