**Review:** What is the difference between a round and flat character, between a static and developing character? Also see SHHS *Handbook* 99.

- Round = a character who is presented in a way that we see more than one aspect of his or her personality. We see strength as well as fear, or we get into his or her head and see complex viewpoints. This character is one who seems realistic, more fully human.
- Flat = a character who has only one prominent attribute/ only one key personality trait. This character's actions and motivation are very predictable.
- Static = Character who experiences no major internal change during course of the work.
- Developing = Character who does experience a major internal change during course of the work.
