

THE BRIDGE TO HOMER'S ODYSSEY: Mythology Reading 211-214

Know these helpful vocabulary words:

sacrilege = violation of what is sacred

• Not one Greek protested against the *sacrilege* (212).

shroud = a cloth to wrap the dead for cremation

• She told them that she could not marry until she had woven a very fine...shroud for Odysseus' father, the aged Laertes, against the day of his death (213).

wrath (n) = anger
wrathful (adj) = angry

- Athena's wrath was deep (212).
- After Troy fell, she [Athena] included him [Odysseus] with the others in her *wrathful* displeasure (213).

perilous = very dangerous

• Year after year he voyaged, hurried from one *perilous* adventure to another (213).

FYI "lay violent hands on" = attempt to rape!

5. How long has Odysseus been away from his home (add length of war + total time he spent trying to get home after the war)?

More questions - Answer these in full sentences.

- 6. Before the Greeks left Troy, what exactly did they do that really displeased Athena?
- 7. How were the Greeks punished by Athena and Poseidon?
- 8. When Athena decides to forgive Odysseus and help him get home, who is the only deity to still be mad at Odysseus? (Hint: Athena waits until this deity is gone from Olympus before she asks Zeus to help Odysseus.)
- 9. What is the big problem that *Odysseus's wife and son* are facing when Athena decides to finally help Odysseus?
- 10. What is Odysseus's problem? Why can't *Odysseus* come home without Zeus's help? Who is holding him "prisoner"? How bad (or good) are Odysseus's living conditions? Give specifics.
- 11. When Athena visits Telemachus, what did she "advise him strongly" to do?
- 12. What disguise does Athena wear when she visits Ithaca?
- 13. What trick does Penelope use to temporarily stop the suitors from insisting that she pick one of them to marry? (Hint it involves a *shroud*)
