- 4. Odysseus says losing his six men to Scylla was "the most pitiable sight" he encountered. Why would this be worse than his experience with the Cyclops or the Laestrygonians?
- 5. What portents occur that indicate that Helios's cattle are magical and don't "die"?

6. What do we already know will happen in the remainder of the book? (Consider Tiresias's prophecy, Circe's prediction, Penelope's sister's (the phantom's) prediction about Telemachus, and the prophecy about the Phaeacian ship.) What don't we know?
