<u>The Prompt</u> (question to be answered): Should a high school assign required summer reading to ninth-grade students in a College Prep level course? Consider this topic, take a clear position on this issue and write **to persuade** your reader (mo) to adopt your position. Consider the information found in the powepaper articles

(me) to adopt your position. Consider the information found in the newspaper_articles that we have read for class, as well as your own experiences.

Answer the prompt in a well-written essay that

- Clearly states your position in the thesis statement, which is followed by a preview of support.
- Includes specific facts, details, reasons, and examples to persuade your reader to agree with your point of view,
- Presents your ideas in a clear and logical order, including an introduction, body and conclusion,
- Uses a variety of words and well constructed sentences,
- Demonstrates correct grammar, spelling, punctuation, capitalization and usage.

Your essay plan/ outline is due ______. Type it following the Essay Plan Format attached. Before drafting the outline, be sure to read the <u>SHHS Handbook 1-5</u>, and <u>Evergreen</u> 246-8. You should use the following checklist to determine the sufficiency of your outline:

Thesis statement (also see "What Is a Thesis?" handout):

- □ Clear in its meaning
- One complete sentence
- □ An opinion, not a fact
- □ Unified and focused/ not overbroad, vague, or wishy-washy
- Not an announcement
- □ No "I think" or 'I believe"

Each MSP:

- Clear
- □ Logically supports and relates to the thesis (generally should include the words "required summer reading")
- □ Follows a logical order
- Is sufficiently supported by at least 2-3 relevant, persuasive arguments and/ or examples
- Expresses an idea that does not overlap with or repeat the MSP of another paragraph

The MSP's put together with the Thesis:

- The MSP's add up to proving all parts of the thesis
- □ The MSP's don't argue points that go beyond the thesis
- The MSP's and thesis taken together make an insightful, persuasive argument that would move an open-minded reader to agree with the argument.
