Checklist + Rubric - First Graded Draft / Summer Reading Essay

(0-10) Focus: Clear thesis/ entire essay relevant to and supportive of thesis

Thesis answers prompt clearly + precisely+ without any waffling/ thesis uses key words of prompt Topic sentences contain key words referring to required summer reading Body paragraphs maintain focus on the MSP of that paragraph Conclusion ties everything together and has rethesis / call to action consistent w thesis

(0-10) Content: Includes enough relevant detail and analysis to support thesis and each topic sentence.

- Effective title
- Each MSP specifically relates to "required summer reading"
- Each body paragraph has 2-3 relevant supporting points (3 are best)
- Each point is supported persuasively with relevant examples
- Each point is supported with logical analysis that ties it back to the MSP
- All examples and arguments are presented in a way that the reader will easily understand them
- Arguments are convincing and logical
- All factual statements are accurate
- no repeats of ideas/ no irrelevant ideas

(0-10) Organization:

- Expanded Introduction
 - **broad, easy-reading statement** to open/ hook is even better
 - includes relevant background
 - o funnels down *smoothly* to thesis
 - o concludes with one sentence thesis followed by preview of support
- Body paragraphs
 - Each begins with a **topic sentence** that is a general statement of the MSP of paragraph.
 - no overlaps in ideas
 - each has a smooth closing sentence
 - o ideas are arranged in a logical order
 - o clear closure sentence at end of each paragraph that sums up MSP for the reader
- Conclusion
 - echoes MSP's
 - ends with rethesis/ call to action
 - smooth, not abrupt, adds closure
- Body paragraphs are all summarized/ covered by thesis statement
- Transitions at start of $2^{nd} + 3^{rd}$ body paragraph, and within body paragraphs to link examples and to shift smoothly to new points within the paragraph (See *Handbook* 20)

(0-10) Style: Smooth flow to sentences/ good word choice

Avoidance of

- unnecessary repetition of words
- empty, immature, vague, slangy words see prompt packet
- use of first person (*I*, *me*) or second person (*you*, *your*) pronouns except in body paragraph examples
- announcements

(0-10) Conventions:

- no contractions (not MLA-worthy!)/ follows Rules of Academic Writing handout
- no CCW errors
- MLA Format: heading, pagination, title (cites and Works Cited page if we cover this)
- proofread/ no misspellings or missing words

Miscellaneous (can add or lose points):

- on time? rubric stapled to top of draft? all drafts, outline, peer edit sheets in folder? apparent effort?
- comments and targets in outline + peer editor sheets are addressed
