## **Subject-Verb Agreement**

**Rule** = Subject and Verb <u>must agree</u> in *number*.

**Translation** = singular subjects take singular verbs; plural subjects take plural verbs.

- Dan works there.
- Dan and Dylan work there.

**∠Application**: As the subject changes, the verb must change.

This only happens in third person, present tense, except for was/were, has/ have

- Dan worked there
- Dan and Dylan worked there.

**† Problem Area # 1**: Prepositional phrases or long word group separates subject from verb.

☆Important rule— the subject of a sentence can **NEVER** be in a prepositional phrase.

**Solution**: Follow these directions for 1-6 below.

- cross out prepositional phrases
- □ circle the real subject
- underline the verb
- read the subject with the verb and check for agreement
  - One of my students is/ are here.
  - Three of my students is/ are here.
  - An enormous flock of hundreds of honking Canadian geese has/ have come to rest by the lake behind my house.
